


## Agreement between Politecnico di Milano and **China Scholarship Council**





# Chinese Students wishful destinations: results in Beijing and Shanghai- Source: Education Expo, Uni-Italia, 2011




According to data collected from chinese authorities the total number of **Chinese students in the EU in 2010** was between **118,700 and 120,000** – about six times more than in 2000.


The number of Chinese students studying in the EU is generally increasing, particularly in Finland, France, **Italy**, the Netherlands and Sweden. However growth is slowing down in the UK, Ireland, Belgium (NL), and declines were reported in Germany and Denmark.

Chinese students studying in the EU are generally concentrated in the fields of **economics/business and technology/engineering.** Most study at the undergraduate level. Generally, less than **10% study at doctoral (PhD) level.** 













## What is **CSC**?

The China Scholarship Council (CSC) is a non-profit institution affiliated with the Ministry of Education.


## CSC main aims:
